Nano neuro knitting: Peptide nanofiber scaffold for brain repair and axon regeneration with functional return of vision

Neuroscientists have demonstrated the repair of mouse brain tissue after an incision which removed the facility of sight. 6 weeks after injecting a paste of self assembling peptides into the incision some sight was restored, unlike in control animals. The self assembling peptides form a scaffold of nanofibres through which axonal regeneration seems to have occurred without scar formation.

There are many tissues which could be repaired by this technique; a demonstration of repair in the spinal cord would be of particular interest.
